

## Precautions before Application and Use of Dialysis

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To apply for dialysis in Japan, fill in the entry sheet after reading and understanding the following descriptions.

### [About Dialysis]

To have dialysis in Japan is to be involved in medical practice between the patient and the medical institute based on Japanese laws. JMHC supports procedures for acceptance of the patient in the medical institute. JMHC prepares the documents required by the medical institute, facilitates the medical expense payment, and arranges an interpreter commissioned by the medical institute after obtaining the medical institute's agreement on the acceptance of the patient. JMHC bears no responsibility for the dialysis procedure.

### [Requirements for having dialysis in Japan]

1. The medical institute has agreed to perform the dialysis.
  - 1) The documents required by the medical institute for the acceptance have been presented/submitted.
  - 2) The patient is not positive for HB antigen.
  - 3) If the patient is positive for HCV antigen, that has been reported previously.
2. The patients have agreed to the dialysis bill presented by the medical institute.
3. The dialysis bill has been paid by the departure (for Japan).
4. The patient has submitted the Informed Consent to the medical institute.
5. The patient has obtained approval prior to the departure from the attending physician in the home country at the patient's own responsibility.
6. The patient meets other requirements presented by the medical institute and JMHC.

### [Other precautions]

1. The start time of the dialysis may be changed from the scheduled time for reasons of the medical institute.
2. Submit the consent form for the examination, the medical certificate from the medical institute where the patient regularly visits in the home country, and other documents after the Japanese medical institute has agreed to accept the patient and the treatment date has been confirmed.
3. Apply for dialysis by the date 14 days before the expected first dialysis procedure date.
4. If the dialysis bill has not been paid all by the time the patient departs (for Japan), the reservation will be canceled.
5. If any expenses occur in addition to the dialysis fee (e.g., fee for specially prescribed medicine), also pay these expenses before coming to Japan.

6. Pay the expenses that occur on the day of dialysis directly to the medical institute.
7. A cancellation fee may be imposed if the dialysis is canceled at the patient's request after paying the dialysis bill.
